#### 50 APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

An apology for absence was received from R. Cockburn. The reason for absence was noted and accepted.

## 51 MINUTES – 6 SEPTEMBER 2022

The minutes of the meeting held on 6<sup>th</sup> September, 2022 were agreed as a correct record and were signed by the Chair.

## 52 DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

Cllr Alexander declared a personal interest in matters relating to the WI Hall. No requests for dispensations were received.

# 53 POLICE REPORT

The newsletter for the Wigton/Aspatria/Silloth area had been circulated prior to the meeting.

## 54 PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

A representative from Boltons, Ireby and Uldale First Responders had asked to attend a future meeting of the parish council to give an update on the First Responders. It was agreed to invite the representative to attend the next parish council meeting on 3<sup>rd</sup> January. No other matters were raised.

## 55 MATTERS ARISING FROM THE MEETING ON 6 SEPTEMBER 2022

Crosby House Barn – The dilapidated state of the barn had been raised again with the Borough Council. It was noted that some remedial work had recently been carried out. It was agreed to continue to monitor this. The Borough Council are also looking at the condition of another property in Ireby which had been raised with them in 2021.

HMRC – The Clerk reported that HMRC had confirmed that the penalties issued in the quarter ended 5 July 2022 had been cancelled. Despite being registered to pay PAYE quarterly an EPS has to be submitted for every month that a payment is not made to HMRC.

### 58 HIGHWAYS/HIGHWAY MAINTENANCE

(a) Highway issues in the Parish

The pot hole on the Ireby to Boltongate road had been repaired.

The street lights at High Ireby have been fixed.

Highways had advised that they will not be taking any action at this point regarding the overgrown verges on the Ireby to Uldale road as no safety issues had been identified at this location

Highways had requested further information regarding the road surface breaking up by tree roots at High Ireby.

Highways had advised they have arranged for a vactor wagon and CCTV to investigate the drainage issues near Grange Farm, High Ireby.

Cllr Alexander reported that the drains had been cleaned out at Sun Croft Ireby. Cllr Moore suggested that Highways should be requested to clean all drains in the parish The Chairman reported that the recent patching work carried out in three areas on the Ireby to Uldale road had washed out.

It was reported that resulting from heavy rainfall a quantity of stone had washed out onto Snittlegarth lonning.

The Clerk reported that the overgrown state of Greengate lonning had been reported to the Countryside Access Team at Cumbria County Council.

An emergency road closure had been put in place for the C2021 Aughertree road due to the likelihood of danger as a result of damage to high voltage mains electricity. The notice took effect on 19<sup>th</sup> October and the restriction will be required for 20 days.

## (b) Lengsthman

Cllr Alexander reported that the Northern Fells Village Agent for Castle Sowerby and Mungrisdale had suggested that the parish council should consider employing a lengthsman to carry out minor jobs in the Parish. Members discussed the practicalities of employing a lengthsman. It was agreed to obtain some further information. The Chairman agreed to speak to Mungrisdale PC with regard to the costs involved. Cllr Perry agreed to make similar enquiries at her other parishes.

## 59 TREE MAINTENANCE/SAFETY INSPECTIONS

Cllr Moore reported on two issues in the parish. The cherry tree on the green at the top of the whent has ivy growing up the trunk and has a mass growing in the crown. It had been raised and discussed at the last meeting that the tree needs to be trimmed back in January/February time. In the meantime, Cllr Moore agreed to cut back the ivy to prevent any damage to the tree. A parishioner had reported an issue with the trees on the parish land opposite Whinney Tip. One tree had fallen into the road and had been made safe. It was thought this had been caused by the weight of the ivy growing on it. Other trees on the land also have ivy growing on them and are leaning into the road. RESOLVED that CWB Forestry would be asked to inspect the trees and provide a quotation for the work required.

## 60 DONATION REQUEST – GROUNDS MAINTENANCE EQUIPMENT

The request raised at the last meeting that members consider granting funding towards the purchase of a strimmer for use in the parish was discussed. It was agreed that before the parish council can consider granting any funding a formal group needs to be set up similar to the former Footpath Group.

## 61 DONATION REQUEST – GREAT NORTH AIR AMBULANCE SERVICE

The request for financial assistance received from the Great North Air Ambulance Service was considered. It was proposed, seconded therefore RESOLVED that the donation granted be increased to £350.00.
